





Toward General Convention (GC81)



About:

The General Convention—The Episcopal Church's governing body—meets every three years as a bicameral legislature. Any resolution must be agreed upon by both the House of Deputies and House of Bishops before it becomes an official act of convention.

Legislative Committee Hearings:

The work of GC81 has already begun, with legislative committees meeting online. These committees will bring resolutions to the floor at the in-person convention in June. Anyone is welcome to attend committee meetings/hearings as an observer, and if you wish to speak at an open hearing you should register at least two business days prior to the hearing.




